The Spectres movement was originally founded in 2001 and has grown into Australia's premier social and competitive basketball community for LGBTQIA+ players and supporters.

Melbourne Spectres Basketball Club Inc. recognises **Spectres Australia** as the national governing body of the Spectres basketball brand. As an affiliated member, we collaborate closely with Spectres Australia and our fellow city-based clubs to uphold and promote the core Spectres values of **community**, **friendship**, and **respect**.

Locally, we run free weekly basketball training sessions at Prahran High School, open to all members of the LGBTQIA+ and Allies community. - Ongoing Uniform Subsidies: Ensuring all members have access to affordable uniforms.
- Ongoing Competition Subsidies: Ensuring all members have access to participate in Tuesday and Wednesday night competition games.
- Social Activities (e.g., indoor rock climbing, Tenpin bowling, Movie nights, NBL Games): Budgeting for non-basketball activities that contribute to the club's growth and camaraderie.

Focus on Social Activities:

In addition to our core focus on basketball, we recognise the importance of fostering a vibrant social community within our club.
